Tonnerre premier cru. Elegant yet relatively

Tonnerre stony notes. 20% oak adds to the
complexity on the palate. Drink 2022-2028

Part of Chablis 2019: Full vintage report and top-scoring wines

When Samuel Billaud split from Billaud-Simon, he managed to retain his favourite plot within Vaillons. Lovely colour here - just a touch of brilliant gold flashes in the glass. So pure! Crystalline, stone fruit character and some floral notes on the palate with great finesse and concentration. An ultra-fine expression of Sechet.

Drinking Window 2021 - 2026

Samuel Billaud, Chablis, Vaudésir Grand Cru, Burgundy, 2019: 93

Blind tasted by Andy Howard MW(at London, 09 Oct 2020)

A blend of two sites, one east- and one west-facing, this Vaudésir has been fermented in oak before ageing in demi-muid for a year. The oak still needs a little longer to settle down with spices - nutmeg and cinnamon - still very evident. Fresh, salty characters provide enticing, balancing, freshness. Give it some time in bottle and this will be a very fine Grand Cru. Drinking Window 2023 – 2030

Samuel Billaud, Chablis, 1er Cru Montée de Tonnerre, 2019 : 93

Blind tasted by Andy Howard MW(at London, 09 Oct 2020)

Wholly owned by leading producer Samuel Billaud, this is a fine expression of the benchmark Montée de Tonnerre Premier Cru. Elegant yet relatively forward, this shows a great combination of purity, depth and classic terroir stony notes. 20% oak adds to the complexity on the palate.

Drinking Window 2022 - 2028

Samuel Billaud, Chablis, 1er Cru Vaillons, Burgundy, 2019: 92

Blind tasted by Andy Howard MW(at London, 09 Oct 2020)

Billaud makes this from a blend of both his own and brought-in grapes. From a number of different sites around Vaillons, this shows some of the classic floral, perfumed notes of the appellation. It has a fine line of acidity and very pure, crystalline character to the fruit. A generous Premier Cru which is drinking well now but has the structure to last.

Drinking Window 2021 - 2027

Samuel Billaud, Chablis, Petit Chablis, Burgundy, 2019: 92

Blind tasted by Andy Howard MW(at London, 09 Oct 2020)

Tank sample. Billaud refers to this as 'sur les Clos' as the 15 -25 year-old vines are situated just above the Grand Cru. A great insiders wine which shows the potential for Petit Chablis in 2019. Quite deep in colour, there is so much depth and character for a Petit Chablis here. Not really an AOP Chablis competitor - more comparable to Premier Cru.

Drinking Window 2021 - 2025

Samuel Billaud, Chablis, 1er Cru Les Fourneaux, 2019 : 91
